Statement

At Cummersdale the intention is for children to gain an understanding of what music is through listening, singing, playing, evaluating, analysing and composing across a wide range of musical genres. We believe children need to understand and value the importance of music in the wider community and are able to use their musical skills, knowledge and experiences to involve themselves in music in a variety of different contexts. This is embedded both in the classroom activities as well as assemblies, whole school performances and learning of instruments.

The aims of our music curriculum are to develop children who:

- Can sing and use their voices individually and in a group
- Create and compose music on their own and with others
- Use technology appropriately when composing
- Have opportunities to learn a musical instrument
- Listen to, review and evaluate the work of various composers
- Enjoy and appreciate a range of different musical styles

We will use Kapow schemes of work to support the teaching of music within the classroom, other IT based apps will be used to further enhance the learning.
