STAFF NEWS

CHESTER ZOO – Tuesday 23rd January

The Chester Zoo Trip will take place on Tuesday next week. With 100 children going and all staff, it should be great day. Here is some information which will help the day go smoothly for all.

Please arrive at school at **7.15am.** The front of the school will be open (the back won't) and children will be able to go to the toilet one last time before departure. We will board the bus at about 7.20-7.25am and intend to leave as close to 7.30am as possible.

Although there are toilets on the buses, we intend to have a very brief toilet stop at Charnock Richard Services and somewhere similar on the return journey.

Children will need a packed lunch and this should be placed in a suitable bag like a rucksac which can be carried around the Zoo. It is always easier if the children have their hands free.

School will provide a snack (fruit/biscuits etc) which will be eaten on the way. No sweets should be brought.

The weather forecast suggests that it will rain for some of the day but will be quite mild, so please make sure your children wear a waterproof coat that will keep them as dry as possible with gloves and a hat recommended. Uniform should be worn underneath.

Children can bring magazines, games, puzzles to occupy them on the journey, but do think sensibly about what can be used on a coach.

Travel sickness tablets for the journey home can be given to teachers to administer to pupils in readiness for the return journey.

The children have been allocated into groups within their classes which will be supervised by two adults.

No spending money is required.

Our expected return time is **6.45pm**, although much depends on when we leave the zoo, how much traffic there is and whether we stop on the journey back. We will give an updated expected time of arrival when we are at Kendal which will be approximately an hour from home.

We have had incidences of them being lost or broken which creates problems in school.

MAKE UP

We are also having problems with children wearing make up at school. This has never been a problem previously but seems to be creeping in at Y5 and Y6. Whilst lip balms can be used, especially in cold weather, this does not include lip gloss. Acrylic nails are not permitted – they seem to stop children being able to hold a pen. Whilst we understand that sometimes nail varnish may stay on following a party, if this privilege is abused and nail varnish is worn routinely, we will have to disallow this and provide materials for its removal.

Both make up and jewellery may be worn if absolutely necessary on our non-uniform days.
