

### WORLD BOOK DAY

The school will be celebrating World Book Day on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> March. This year we would like children to come dressed as a word. This could be something as simple as a colour or something clever like an such as 'injured', 'love' or 'danger' or could even be 'Roman', Wizard' or 'Dragon'. It is hoped that families would be able to look at what they've got at home and adapt, rather than rush out and buy something.
