#### **BIKEABILITY**

The week beginning 19<sup>th</sup> May, children in Y5 and 6 will be taking part in their Bikeability Training. (Cycling proficiency). Cyclewise (based at Whinlatter) will come to the school to assess the children and get them practising their manoeuvres on the roads nearby so that they can become safe cyclists.

The children will be in groups which will go out at differing times throughout the week, but some groups are not cycling every day. All children will start cycling on the MUGA/field at first and all bikes will be checked to see whether they are roadworthy. The instructors are usually quite adept at adjusting seats, brakes, tyres etc. Do remember a helmet, but if you do not have one, let the school/instructor know.

Bikes can be brought in daily (or cycled in) or be left on Monday and picked up on Thursday/Friday. They can be put in the bike racks or left around the tables at the back of school. We will ensure that all bikes are brought in to school at the end of each day.
